Jane Metzger Von Haden has been building her family business since the 1980s, when she went to work at the company her grandfather founded in 1939.

She took over as president of Metzger Building Materials after her father retired during the recession and has gone on to lead the company through tough times and triumphs.

The 11-employee company, which supplies materials like drywall, steel and insulation to construction projects, survived the recession without having to lay off any workers. It landed contracts for high-profile construction projects, including Target Field and the Radisson Blu Mall of America.

Last year, the company's sales grew 5 percent, and Metzger Von Haden hopes sales will grow by 10 percent this year. She aims to get the company involved in construction of the new <u>Minnesota Vikings</u> stadium, which she said could bring in millions in revenue.

Outside of leading Metzger, she serves as a volunteer for <u>Habitat for Humanity</u>, where she leads a group of friends on a Woman Build day each summer. She also is involved in several professional organizations and sits on the volunteer committee of the Association of Women Contractors.

What's your personal mantra?

To be strong physically, spiritually, intellectually and to be the best person I can be every day.
